Following the end of my stay at the Institute for Advanced Study in Princeton, I would like to travel for a month in the United States to examine sculpture relevant to my research in American museums and collections. Subsequently, in July and August prior to my return to Turkey, further visits and study in several European museums (London, Paris, Copenhagen, Berlin, Munich, Vienna, Rome and Florence) will be essential for the gathering of comparative material and notes.

3 months: 1 June - 1 September 1968

A volume on the <u>Sculpture from Side in</u> <u>Pamphylia</u> will be published by the Türk Tarih Kurumu (Turkish Historical Society). Articles may also be envisaged in <u>Belleten</u> and various American or European scholarly journals.

2a. Ever since their inception in 1947, I have been field director of the excavations conducted at Side in Pamphylia by Istanbul University. The abundant and significant amount of sculptural material brought to light by these investigations has been the focus of my research and study for the past few years. During my present stay at the Institute for Advanced Study in Princeton, I hope to bring to completion the catalogue of all the sculpture found at Side and simultaneously to initiate the study of some of the statuary unearthed at Aphrodisias in Caria by Professor Kenan T. Erim (under the aegis of New York University). My library and relevant research will be hopefully completed by the end of May. It is necessary, however, for a full evaluation of both the Side and Aphrodisias sculpture to examine further comparative material in museums and collections in the United States and in Europe; such visits would also be most useful to supplement the book on Roman and Early Byzantine Portrait Sculpture in Asia Minor (London, British Academy, 1966) which I prepared in collaboration with E. Rosenbaum-Alfoldi.

The importance of artistic and particularly sculptural activities in Asia Minor during the Roman period has long been neglected. It is only in recent years, since the end of World War II that the singular qualities of this sculpture have begun to be recognised. The statuary found first at Side and more recently at Aphrodisias is chiefly responsible for the understanding that art (and particularly sculpture) in Roman Asia Minor possessed highly individual traits found nowhere else in the Empire.
