



The Weary Heracles
 Roman Imperial, second half of the second century A.D.
 After a prototype by Lysippos of about 330 B.C.
 Marble
 Collected at Aphrodisias and left at the British Museum Foundation. 1901-1902
 In the left hand, Heracles, exhausted from the labor, holds the lion's
 head. He is clothed to the side of his stomach
 with the lion's skin. His right hand was placed behind his back
 and held the water. The lion's head is the original model
 of the Heracles. Heracles' anatomy is described by the
 artist's hand.
