

Ankara acts on treasure

Ankara, Feb. 3

Mr. Orham Oguz, the Turkish Minister of Education, today told me that he has named a group of Turkish experts to determine within a week whether the 137 gold artifacts that will go on display at the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston today originated from Anatolia.

If the experts determine that they were of Anatolian origin Turkey would apply through diplomatic channels for their recovery.

Mr. Naci Temizer, director of the Archaeological Museum in Ankara, said after seeing pictures published in The Times that he was sure the artifacts had originated in Anatolia.

But another prominent Turkish archaeologist, Professor Akurgal, did not share Mr. Temizer's certainty.
